

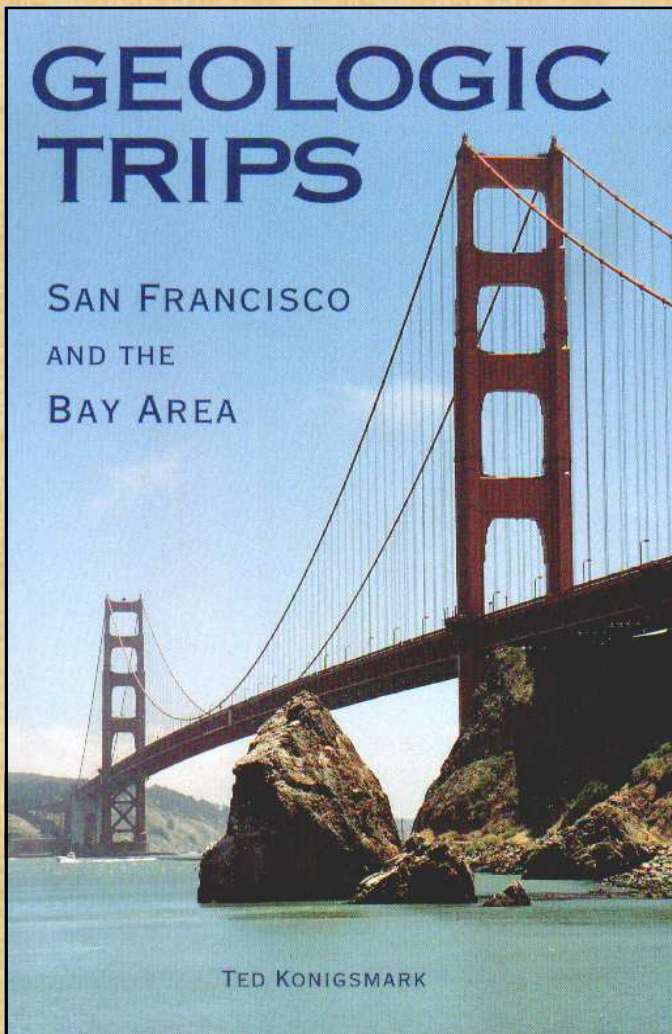

Built on an unusual suite of rocks called the Franciscan and lying between two of the most active and well-known faults in the entire world, these rocks and faults record a tortured, exciting geological past. With this book you will glimpse into that past.

This book, written for the non-geologist, takes the reader on seven geologic trips to many of the Bay Area's scenic landmarks, including Alcatraz Island, Fort Point, the Cliff House, the Marin Headlands, Angel Island, Fort Funston, Crystal Springs Reservoir and the Point Reyes Peninsula. On these trips you will learn about the geologic processes that have formed the rocks and landscape of the Coast Ranges of northern California. You can also walk and drive along the San Andreas and Hayward faults and learn how these faults affect life in the Bay Area.

Ted Konigsmark spent most of his career as an oil geologist, involved with geological research and studies in many different parts of the world. Recently retired, Ted now lives with his wife, Marilyn, on the northern California coast. Ted graduated from U.C.L.A. in 1952 and received a Ph.D. degree in geology from Princeton University in 1958.
